Description This course is a statutory requirement for all crew members working onboard commercial vessels in Queensland.
Careers & Pathways Certificate of Competence as Coxswain
Entry Requirements You must be 16 years of age, have a minimum of year 10 with a sound achievement in English and Mathematics or the equivalent, or gain mature age entry.
Pre-requisites There are no pre-requisites for this course.
Fees The cost to enrol in all units of this course with Queensland Marine Training Services is \$595.00.

Location Brisbane, Gold Coast and South East Queensland.
Study Mode Three days of mandatory workshops, comprising two days of underpinning knowledge and one day of practical training and assessing (firefighting and wet drills).
Recognition of Prior Learning Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises your existing experience gained through life or work for which you may not have obtained a formal qualification. We will work with you to identify your existing skills, and assess if you can then achieve a full or part qualification. This also helps to avoid unnecessary duplication of training, saving you time and money.
Other information. Appropriate clothing and protective footwear must be also worn at all times – specific clothing requirements for practical training will be detailed in the joining instructions.
Assessment Procedures A combination of practical and written examinations will be undertaken. The written assessment may consist of assignments and a formal examination.
